

Removal of bottle banks in the South Hams



The removal of bottle banks across the South Hams has now begun, as part of our ongoing efficiency programme of our waste and recycling service.

13 banks across the district have been taken away in the first wave of removals, which began at the start of this week.

The bottle banks removed in the first wave of removals are:

- Tuckenhay - Bank at The Watermans Arms
- California Cross - Bank at the California Cross Inn
- Churchstow - Bank at the Church House Inn
- Hemerdon - Bank at The Miners Arms
- Heybrook Bay - Bank at The Eddystone Inn
- Marldon - Bank at the Church House Inn
- Ringmore - Bank at the Journey's End
- Shaugh Prior - Bank at the White Thorn Inn
- Yealmpton - Bank at Ben's Farm Shop
- Wotter - Bank at the Moorland Inn
- Kingswear - Bank at Darthaven Marina
- Stokenham - Two banks at Stokeley Farm Shop

The second phase of removals begins on 24 February. Ten banks are to be removed from the least used sites in public settings.

The banks set to be removed in phase 2 are:

- Rattery Village Hall
- Noss Mayo, tennis court car park
- Loddiswell, Butts Car Park
- Harbertonford Car Park
- East Prawle, layby
- Strete, layby
- Beesands seafront

- Woolwell Community Centre
- Lee Moor, Village Hall
- Modbury, Poundwell Meadow

The third and final phase is scheduled to start from 17 March. 15 bottle banks across nine sites will remain in place, to support the visitor economy in the busy summer months.

Residents wanting to recycle glass can put glass bottles and jars in Recycling Box 1, along with mixed paper. Broken glass can either be disposed of safely with your refuse collection (wrap it up safely to protect our crews) or at your nearest household waste recycling centre.
